My boyfriend Jaydon and I had broken up. It was a little while later that I found myself at Alpha Center and was stunned to learn I was pregnant. An abortion would have been the easy answer. However, I knew it was wrong and was grateful to be in a place that would support my decision to parent my child. Unfortunately, I became involved in a relationship with a much older, abusive and manipulative man. I stayed with him, feeling trapped, even as he became increasingly violent. And then, my Grandpa Theodore, whom I was very close to, passed away suddenly and I sank to an all-time low. It was the darkest time of my life.

Burdened under the weight of emotions and anxiety, in addition to being scared for my safety and the safety of my unborn baby, I finally opened up to an Alpha Center advocate at one of my weekly appointments about the details of my unhealthy relationship. I will never forget the hard questions she asked and the way she listened to what I had to say. Our conversation gave me the courage I needed to call law enforcement and experience freedom from the mental and physical trauma I had been enduring. From that day forward, I felt empowered and knew I could put my trust in God who knows and cares for me.





God continued to use Alpha
Center and others to shine light
into my darkness. I got back
together with Jaydon and our
daughter, Everly Theodore, was
born on November 3, 2019. Her
life is so precious to us and her
middle name is a sweet
reminder of my grandpa's
legacy. We have continued
together in Alpha Center's Earn
While You Learn program,
choosing to do online lessons
when COVID-19 prevented us
from going into the center this

past year. Jaydon and I are getting married in our church next May and understand the importance and privilege of parenting Everly together.

This Christmas season, we are thankful that God's steadfast light shines in our darkest moments, and we are grateful for those who make Alpha Center's light possible in this community. –RANESSA
